VILLAGE FACILITIES

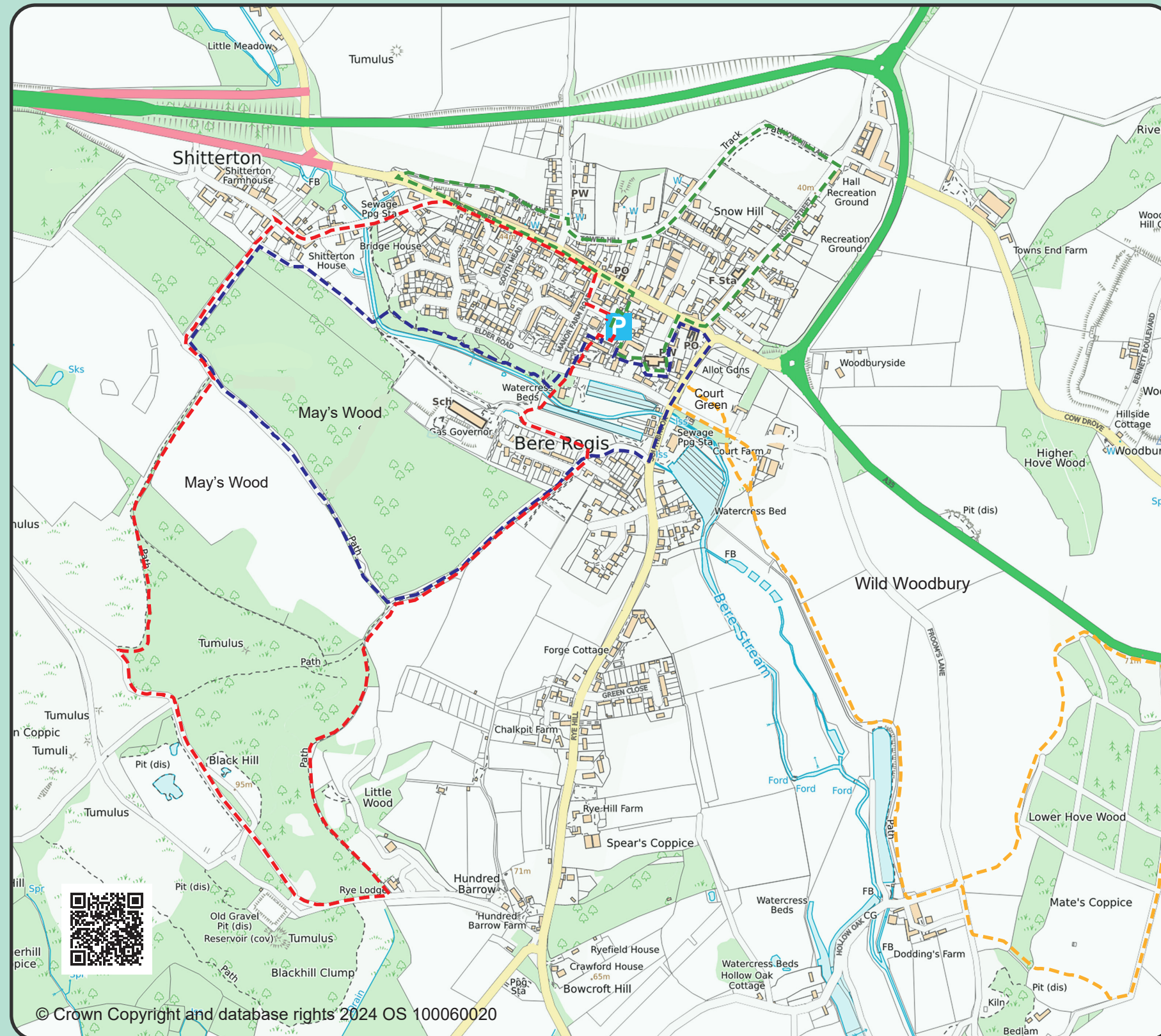
- During your visit to Bere Regis, please make use of the village's facilities. These include a well-stocked village shop and post office, plus two pubs serving a range of drinks and food.
- The Norman church of St John the Baptist is also well worth a visit.

Walk 1 - Green - Bere Regis Village
One mile or 30 minutes around the historic village, mainly on paved surfaces with some paths that can be slippery after wet weather



Walk 2 - Blue - May's Wood & Bere Stream.
Two miles or 50 minutes walk in woodland and streamside near the village, mainly on gently sloping paths that can be muddy and slippery after wet weather.



Walk 3 - Red - Black Hill, May's Wood & Bere Regis. Three miles or 70 minutes walk in woodland and heathland with good views over surrounding countryside, mainly on paths (steep in places) that can be muddy and slippery after wet weather.



Wild Woodbury Walk - Orange. A circular walk through the public access sections of the Dorset Wildlife Trust's Wild Woodbury rewilding project, 2.5 miles or 75 minutes over meadows, rough tracks and woodland. For further information see DWT information boards.
